Madison Area Bus Advocates on Transit Equity Day 2026

This certificate is presented in recognition of Transit Equity Day, observed annually on February 4th in honor of the birthday of Rosa Parks, whose courageous act of resistance helped ignite the Civil Rights Movement and whose legacy continues to inspire the ongoing work toward equality. Transit Equity Day affirms that public transportation is a civil right and an essential public service, fundamental to dignity, opportunity, and full participation in community life.

Reliable, affordable, and accessible public transit, along with the solidarity shared between transit riders and transit workers who make these systems function, connect people to jobs, education, healthcare, and community resources, support family-sustaining and union jobs, and play a critical role in addressing the climate crisis by reducing greenhouse gas emissions and harmful air pollution. At the same time, this day calls attention to the persistent racial, economic, and disability-based inequities in transit access that disproportionately affect people of color, low-income residents, people with disabilities, seniors, and other marginalized communities.


